1963 Räinfall Lightest In 17 Years

According to the eccoris of the Soil Conservation Service rainfall in Allegany County was the lightest since 1949. The fotal rainfall for 1963 was 25.63". The October rainfall this year was the lowest on record .24"

The yearly average rainfall for 17 years has been 30.91" at Belmont. Among the low years were 1949 — 23.23"; 1954 — 25.93"; 1957—26.92".

1962 was not a dry year but early growing season rainfall was light. The truth is that 1962 had

light. The truth is that 1902 had above average rainfall of 32.73". It is apparent that the ground absorbed and stored snow melt in the snying of 1963 resulting infairly good first cutting hay yields. Good conservation practices, which allow soils to obsorb water where the release it rainfully into

rather than release it rapidly into our drainage systems aid in ob-taining good yields even during dry seasons.
