The minutes of the annual meeting of 1963, held on January 15th, were read for information as were the minutes of the last regular meeting held on Nov. 22nd 1963.

It was reported that the repairs had been completed to the outside of the Library Building, and that the vestibule to the Library had been repainted.

It was reported and recorded in the minutes that the Andover Chamber of Commerce had contributed the sum of \$325.00 for Library repairs, which was very commendable.

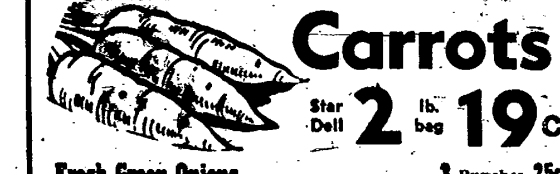
