Life insurance company statisticians report that the number

of marriages in the United States increased 1.9 per cent in 1962 and that it was the fourth consecutive year to record a rise. There were about 1,579,000 marriages in the country last year, compared with 1,550,000 in 1961 and 1,525,000 in 1960.

The number of polio cases reported in 1963 is likely to be under 460, or less than one half the previous record low of 910 cases in 1962. In contrast, an average

of nearly 39,000 cases a year were reported in the period 1960 to 1964 in the United States, with a high of 58,000 in 1952. In 13 states not a single case of the disease was reported during the first eleven months of 1963, the statisticians said.
