Notice To Owners And Harborers Of Dogs

Dog licenses for 1963 expired on December 31, 1963. The 1964 license fee is due January 1st. Licenses so issued will cover the period from January to December 31, 1964. Every dog must wear a tag of the current dog license year. A dog without such a tag is not protected by law and no action can be maintained for no action can be maintained for

his injury or destruction.

An unlicensed dog, must be seized and killed and the fact that a dog is without a tag is presump-tive evidence that the dog is un-

Dog licenses must be obtained from the clerk of the city or town where the dog is harbored or

where the dog is harbored or kept.

License fees: Male Dog, \$2.25; Female Dog, \$5.25; Spayed Female Dog, \$2.25.

No license can be issued for less than the full license year.

The owner of a dog, who fails or refuses to obtain a license for the dog as required by law incurs a penalty of \$10.00 and costs.

The enumerators of towns and the police department of cities are required to prepare in January of each year a list of dog ary of each year a list of dog owners. The omission of the name of an owner from such lists will not excuse the owner from

obtaining a license.

If you owned a dog last year and do not own one now, so advise the clerk of your town or

city.

Dog licenses in the Town of Andover may be obtained from Mrs. Glenora Pelton, Town Clerk.
