

Andover To Receive DDD Service

During the summer, Andover telephone subscribers of the Allegany Telephone Company, will be able to dial direct to over 60 million other telephones in the United States and Canada. This will be accomplished without the necessity of going through local long distance operators. Long distance dialing by subscribers directly to other cities will greatly speed service, and this new method of calling friends and business associates in other cities is as easy as though one were dialing another telephone in Andover.

Plan for the long distance dialing program got under way four months ago. Material for the new outside telephone plant is on the site, and it is expected that construction will commence next week. The central office automatic switching equipment is on order and delivery is expected in about four months.

Andover's connection with the nationwide direct distance dialing network will be made through the Hornell exchange of the New York Telephone Company.

According to Roger J. Tuttle, District Manager, of the Independent Telephone Corporation, "introduction of direct distance dialing service is another giant step toward our goals for the improved service we are eager to give our subscribers. It is another indication of how well the nations 28 hundred independent telephone companies work with the Bell System, to provide the most modern and convenient service to customers across the country. Often the independent telephone companies are far ahead of the Bell System companies in providing modern service."

The Allegany Telephone Company converted to dial operation in 1951. The subscribers in the Alfred and Almond exchanges have had direct distance dialing since February 3, 1963.
