At the last meeting we made cinnamon apples which turned out swell.

Recipe for Cinnamon Apples:

4 medium apples

1/4 cup water

1/4 cup sugar

1/4 teasp. salt

NOTE: (We used red cinnamon candy)

Wash and core apples; Peel up front of each apple.

Place sugar, water and salt in skillet or sauce pan. Heat to boiling; Stir until sugar is dissolved.

Put apples in syrup, stem ends down. Cover and boil gently 5 minutes.

Turn apples gently, bringing stem end up. Cover and cook 3 minutes longer or until apples are tender, but still hold their shape.

Lift apples from pan to serving dish. Boil syrup 3 minutes, longer or until thick, spoon it over the apples then serve hot or cold.

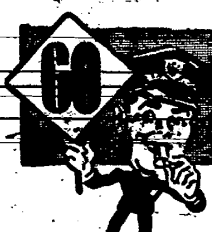
