Local volunteers, responding with a pumper simultaneously with Alfred Station firefighters who sent two trucks to the scene, were able to save a considerable amount of furniture and clothing. A nearby farm pond provided adequate water with Alfred Station's portable pump supplying the three trucks.

The residence in the Town of West Union, owned by Roy Hazlett and known locally as the McAllister farm, was damaged by fire early Tuesday morning. An overloaded circuit, believed caused by installation of a new electric washer, Monday afternoon was blamed for the early morning fire, which started in a partition between the bathroom and utility area on the north side of the house. **Wood Is Given "Permanent Wave"**

Who wants to tie wooden tongue depressors in knots? Or form them into creative designs—spirals, curlycuse and the like? Not many we'll wager. But such designs illustrate a new, quick method of plasticizing wood just announced by Dr. Conrad Schuerch, chairman of the forest chemistry department, State University College of Forestry at Syracuse University.

From other experimental work, Schuerch thought that liquid ammonia should be ideal for treating wood so that it could be molded or shaped. By placing birch tongue depressors in the solution for 15 to 20 minutes, he found that you could mold them into almost any shape—even tie them into knots. The wood retained these shapes when dry.

"Wood plasticization by liquid ammonia has possible application not only in the bending and forming of wood to make decorative items, corrugated structures for core stock, and possibly furniture, but also is an effective first step prior to mechanical disintegration of wood", Dr. Schuerch announced.

The discovery, which is similar to the permanent waving of hair, works just as well on woods other than birch. In the experiments at the State College of Forestry, pine, oak and basswood were used.

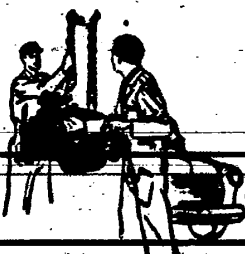
