John A. Krieger, 92, a long time resident of Greenwood died Friday, February 21, 1964, at Tioga where he lived for several years. John was a harness maker in Greenwood about 50 years, beginning in the days of horses and harness shops in every town. His shop was the last to close. Mr. Krieger was one of the original Directors of the former First National Bank of Greenwood continuing the fifty years of its existence 1906-1956. He served many years as Treasurer of the Board of Education before centralization. He was a member of Sentinel Lodge F. & A.M. and the Odd Fellows Lodge in Greenwood. He was survived by three sisters: Mrs. Frederica Close, Mrs. Eva Lavancher, both of Tioga and Mrs. Fanny Berry of Elmira. The funeral was held at the Scureman Funeral Home in Tioga Sunday at 2 p. m. with burial in Tioga.
