Johann Gutenberg was born in 1400 in Manz (Germany). His family later moved to Strasbourg.

In 1438, Gutenberg entered into a partnership with three others to conduct experiments in printing. In Manz, about 1450, Gutenberg joined into a partnership with a goldsmith, Johann Fust and set up a press on which he started printing a large Latin Bible and some smaller books and leaflets.

The famous "Gutenberg Bible" was finished before the middle of 1456, but was actually printed by Peter Schoffer, who was Fust's partner. This book is the first volume known to have been printed with movable metal type.

Perhaps without Gutenberg's invention, the newspapers of today would be printed in a much different way. Maybe, the staff of the Hi Herald would chisel the school paper out of rock or maybe the public would be forced to read our "handwriting", a fate worse than death.

Lent

We are now passing through a period of forty days known as Lent. Many of us give up something during Lent, but how many of us know how it originated?

Lent begins each year on Ash Wednesday and ends Easter Sunday. The length of the fast and the rigor with which it has been observed have varied greatly in different countries. In the time of Irenaeus, the fast before Easter was very short, but very severe; thus some ate nothing for 40 hours between the afternoon of Good Friday and the morning of Easter Sunday.

During the religious confusion of the Reformation, the practice of fasting was generally relaxed and it was found necessary to reassert the obligation by keeping Lent and the other periods and days of abstinence by a series of proclamations and statutes. During the eighteenth century, the strict observance of the Lenten fast was generally abandoned although it was still observed and inculcated by the more earnest of the clergy and the custom of women wearing mourning in Lent, survived until well into the nineteenth century.

Almond Wreaths

Mix together thoroughly -- 1 cup soft shortening (mostly butter)

1/2 cup sifted confectioner's sugar

2 egg yolks

1 tsp salt

1/2 tsp vanilla

1/2 cup oil

1/2 cup sifted Gold Medal flour.

Press the dough through a cookie press onto ungreased baking sheet in shape of wreaths. Brush wreaths with slightly beaten egg white.

Sprinkle with mixture of 2 tbsps. sugar, 1/4 tsp. cinnamon, and 1/4 cup very finely chopped blanched almonds. Bake until set, but not brown. Temperature 350 degrees. Bake 8 to 10 min.
