Mrs. Margaret Merrill Wingate, 70, of 81 N. Main St., Alfred, died Saturday, March 7, 1963 at the St. James Mercy Hospital in Hornell.

She was the wife of Ray Winthrop Wingate, carillonneur of Alfred University, and the daughter of the late John Jake Merrill, state tax commissioner and the late Mrs. Leona Burdick Merrill.

Mrs. Wingate attended school in Albany and Alfred, was graduated in 1915 from Alfred University and taught drawing several years in the local public schools.

She was a member of the First Seventh Day Baptist Church of Alfred, the Allen Civic Amadine Club, Faculty Wives Club and the Alfred Garden Club. She served as a guardian and inspector of Campfire Girls and the area representative of the American Red Cross and American Cancer Society. Mrs. Wingate also was an active sponsor of Lotts Creek School in Kentucky.

For a number of years Mrs. Wingate operated a photographic studio in Alfred, and she was assistant treasurer of Alfred Atlas Sand and Gravel Corp.

Surviving in addition to her husband are one daughter, Mrs. Daniel Rase of Alfred; two grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Robert Campbell, also of Alfred.

Funeral services were held Monday at the Alfred Church, followed by burial at Alfred Rural Cemetery.
