This information was released today from the local Red Cross office in order to keep area Red Cross members and county residents informed on the part Red Cross has played in the recent flood disaster.

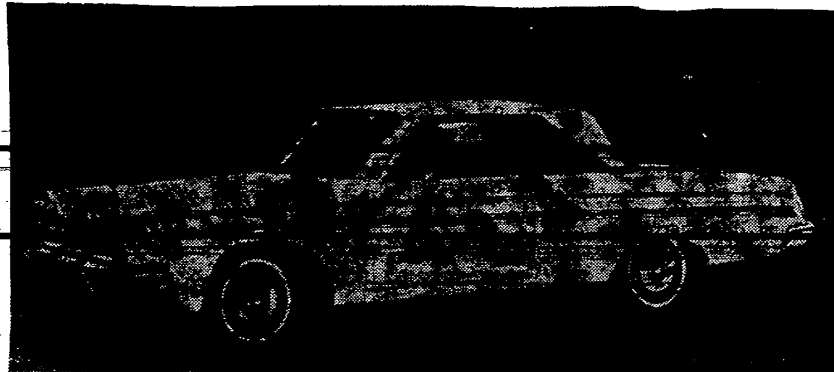
The office also revealed that Red Cross President Alfred M. Gruenther accompanied President Johnson on a low-altitude air survey for the disaster area this week. Stops were made at Pittsburgh, Pa., and Cincinnati, Ohio.

More than 220 Red Cross experienced disaster workers are scattered throughout the flooded

area assisting chapter staffs and hundreds of volunteers. They are providing emergency assistance and taking applications from disaster sufferers for rehabilitation assistance as families return to their homes.
