Boating Deaths During 1963 Drop 11 Per Cent

Boating deaths in New York State during 1963 dropped 11 per cent below the previous year with 66 fatalities reported compared with 74 in 1962, the Conservation Department has announced.

James J. O'Brien, Director of the Department's Division of Motor Boats, said a total of 423 boating mishaps, accounting for 282 personal injuries, was reported in 1963. This compares with 469 accidents and 291 injuries in 1962. More than half of the accidents could have stayed out of the record books, O'Brien said, if boatmen had followed the three C's of safe boating—care, courtesy and common sense.

He based his statement on figures compiled by the Division's enforcement unit which showed 56 per cent of the mishaps attributed to human error rather than mechanical failure.

A total of 105 accident cases was classified under the general heading "carelessness." "Recklessness" and "negligence" ran a close second with 59 each, while "speed" and "drinking" accounted for 15 additional accidents. Other miscellaneous and unidentified causes totaled 73 mishaps.

Of the 66 fatalities reported, 21 accidents (31 per cent) came about as a result of mishaps involving a rowboat or canoe.

Price Support Available To Feed Grain Growers

Growers who participate in the 1964 feed grain program will thereby qualify for price support on their 1964 crops of corn and barley, Stephen Clarke, Chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Allegany County Committee, has announced. Signup for the program will continue at Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service County Office through March 27.

As last year, support for the three crops will be made available partly through loans and purchase agreements and partly through price-support payments. While rates of the loans vary by counties, rates of the price-support payments are the same throughout the country.

Rates of the price-support payments have been set at 15 cents per bushel for corn, 12 cents per bushel for barley. The price-support payments will be made on the normal production of the acreage planted to the two feed grains in matter what disposition is made of 1964—the payment is assured on the crop.

In general, Mr. Clarke explained feed grain producers will participate in the program by reducing their acreages of one or more of the two crops by at least 20 per cent of the farm's base acreage and devoting such acreage to an approved conserving use. By such participation, farmers earn a diversion payment as well as qualify for the loans, purchase agreements and price support payments. Diversion payments under the 1964 program will average higher than last year and the maximum diversion is higher.
