A double-ring ceremony performed at the Andover Methodist Church Saturday, April 4, 1964, solemnized the marriage of Miss Carol Jean Marshall and Alfred John Gross, Jr.

Nuptial vows were pledged at 4 p. m., before the groom's father, Dr. Alfred John Gross, pastor of University Methodist Church in Buffalo, following a prelude of appropriate wedding music provided by organist Mrs. Ralph Burgett. Elaine Bremer sang "O Perfect Love" and "Oh Love That Casts Out Fear."

The bride was escorted to the altar, decorated with tall vases of white gladioli banked by ferns and greenery, by Owen G. Halpin of New York City, a friend of the family. Palms were used at either side of the church.

Attending the bride, daughter of Mrs. Pearl Bradshaw Marshall of Elmhurst, were Miss Faye Guthrie of Owego as maid-of-honor, and the Misses Betty Gluck and Alice Gross, as bridesmaids.
