We arrived at 9:30 at Bailey Hall. There we were placed in our groups.

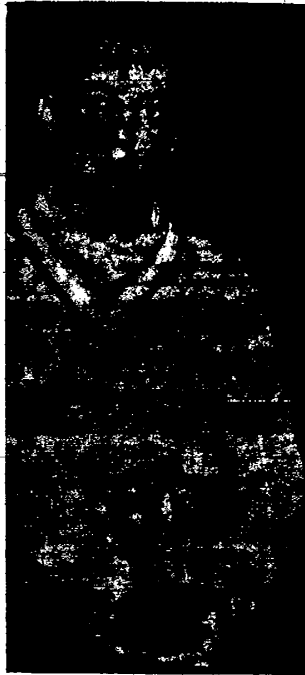
After morning lectures, we assembled at Barton Hall for lunch.
