Red Cross To Offer First Aid Instructors Course

The Red Cross has been teaching The Red Cross has been teaching first aid to Americans continuously since January 1, 1910, with over 21,000,000 certificates issued to adults since then. Until 1924, only Doctors of Medicine could teach first aid, and not until 1937 were instructors classes trained by members of the Red Cross Safety Service staff rather than by doc-Service staff rather than by doctors. These staff members are thoroughly trained experts in their line. The opportunity is now being given to properly certified residents of our County to take the up-to-date instructors course locally.

The Allegany County Chapter of American Red Cross will offer a First Aid Instructors Course in the Fall of 1934, if enough area
