Morris Straight, 46, Friendship, a welder for the New York State Dept. of Public Works, was injured, fatally Wednesday when a spark from his welding torch caused fumes in a metal drum to explode in his face.
 Straight was helping repair a bridge in N. Main St., in Alfred. He had just completed work on an angle-iron to be used in the repair when he turned toward the 55-gallon drum which contained a residue of tar. The explosion followed.
 He died soon after arrival at the Bethesda Hospital in Hornell. Coroner Robert C. Eisenhardt ascribed death to a skull fracture and a brain injury.

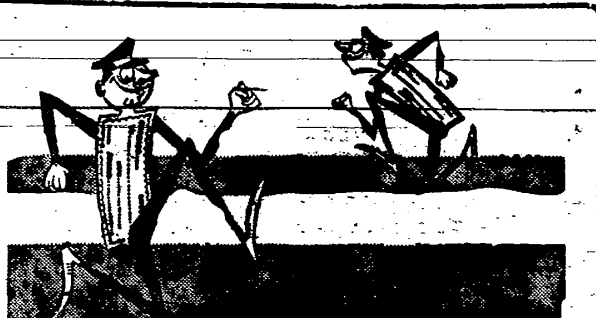
