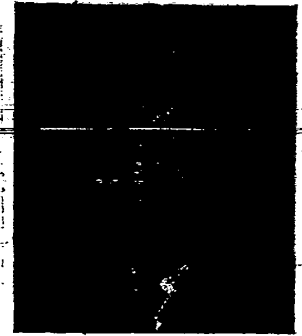

## "Jim" Jackson To Receive "Fireman of the Year" Award

"Jim" Jackson, a member of the Andover Fire Department, has been selected to receive the "Fireman of the Year" award of the Western N. Y. Volunteer Firemen's Association for 1964.

Fireman Jackson has been notified to be in attendance, in uniform, at the convention in Randolph on Wednesday, July 29th at 9:00 A. M. as well as a representative of the local fire company to receive the plaque for the fire company.

"Jim" and his family have been invited to ride in a convertible placed at his disposal for the "Fireman of the Year" for the parade on Wednesday evening at the 65th Annual Convention at the Hotel in Randolph, N. Y., July 27, 28, and 29th.

The Western New York Volunteer Firemen's Association is composed of 14 Counties: Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Niagara, Ontario, Orleans, Steuben, Wayne and Yates.

The selection was made for "Jim's" rescue of a truck driver last October from his burning vehicle on Route 17 near Andover. In visiting with him about the award we found that "Jim" had been down to visit the driver John White, this past Tuesday evening at the Strong Memorial Hospital and found that he is recovering very nicely from his horrible mishap.

However his is still undergoing skin grafts on both his badly burned arm and hand. He has recovered the use of his right arm but naturally won't be able to use it for the duration of this skin graft period which lasts about six weeks.
