18 Year-Old Registrants To Be Examined

New York State Selective Service Local Boards will begin in July to order 18-year-old registrants for complete examination by the Armed Forces, Mr. Backus Chairman, Local Board No. 71, Belmont, N. Y., said today.

Mr. Backus emphasized that the examination of 18-year-olds does NOT mean that they face induction in the immediate future.

large numbers of young men being found disqualified for military
service were interested in obtaining educational, vocational, and
medical rehabilitation.
