Pursuant to authorization of the Board of Supervisors of Allegany County sealed bids will be received by Manley C. Ackerman, Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, at his office in the Courthouse at Belmont, New York, until 10:00 A. M., E.D.T., Monday, July 27, 1964, for the following forest products:

The above forest products are in the Town of Birdsall, Lot No. 19, known as the Griffin Lot and located 3 1/2 miles northeast of Birdsall on the Klipnocker Road. All prospective bidders desiring a conducted view of the site will meet at the office of the Clerk of the Board on July 20, 1964, Monday, at 9:00 A. M., E.D.T. The County of Allegany does not guarantee the estimated quantity or quality of the material for sale. Bidders must satisfy themselves on these points.

The estimated volume are based on the Doyle Log Rule. Deductions have been made for visible defects. Miscellaneous Species includes Elm, Red Maple, Yellow Birch, Cucumber, and Red Oak. All merchantable trees are marked with orange paint, spotted at d.b.h. and at the stump. Trees marked with an "X" of orange paint, spotted at d.b.h. and at the stump, may be cut at the loggers discretion. Skid roads and landings will be laid out under supervision of the County Forester. No skidding will be allowed by tractor with blade attached. Cutting and skidding will start at a point furthest from landings. Utilization shall be to a minimum 8" D. I. B. where straight and sound.

TERMS OF SALE: This sale shall be on a lump sum basis. All bids shall be accompanied by a Certified Check drawn to the order of the County of Allegany, or money order for five per cent (5%) of the amount bid, based on the estimated quantity stated above. All material shall be paid for in advance by the successful bidder at the time of the execution of the contract. The successful bidder will be required to execute a contract accompanied by a surety bond in the amount of \$2,000 for the faithful performance of the awarded contract. Also, he will be required to provide at his own cost and expense a policy of liability insurance in limits of at least \$10,000/\$20,000 and property damage in the amount of \$5,000 for the benefit of the County of Allegany. Said policy shall be written by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New York, and shall include the following clause: "Policy extended to include interest of Allegany County as respects this location". In addition, bidder shall secure and keep in force for the duration of this agreement.

Workmen's Compensation Insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Law and acts amendatory thereof. A certificate of insurance showing proper liability coverage and Workmen's Compensation coverage shall be filed by the successful bidder. The successful bidder shall remove all material from County lands within six months of the date of the contract.

The County of Allegany reserves the right to reject any and all bids if in the best interests of the County will be promoted thereby. The successful bidder will be required to subscribe and affirm under the penalties of perjury to a certificate of non-collusion as required by law.
