**Attend National Future Homemakers of America Convention**

Sharon Hunt, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Hunt of Greenwood, N. Y., is attending the 1964 National Convention of Future Homemakers of America held in Chicago, Illinois. The 3,000 teenage delegates and advisors meeting in Chicago, represent over half a million members in all states, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

The theme of the four-day meeting, planned and conducted by the membership of high school home economics students, is "Education—An Endless Challenge". Dean Herbert W. Schooling of the University of Missouri made the keynote address on this subject at the opening session.

Other sessions during the week were addressed by Mrs. Arthur Goldberg, Washington, D. C., author and wife of the Supreme Court Justice; Dean Robert Schaefer of the College of Education, Teachers College, Columbia University, New York; Dr. John Furby, New York City; Dr. Grose Evans of the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D. C.

A panel program on education needed for successful marriage, reports by Peace Corps returnees about world understanding and reports on FHA activities with senior citizens, school drop-outs and other community programs will be presented during the week.

All of the delegates at the FHA convention are assigned specific responsibilities. Sharon, a senior at Greenwood Central School is the delegate to the Presidents Banquet Representing New York State.

Others in the New York State delegation are from Huntington, Franklin, Newark Valley, Owego, Syracuse, Bliss, Gainsville, Penfield, Victor and Olcott.
