Hornell Symphony Asso. Membership Campaign

The annual membership cam-
 paign of the Hornell Symphony
 Association will be held September
 28 - October 9, it has been an-
 nounced by the association's board
 of directors.

Mrs. James D. McFadden, 111
 Maple St., Hornell, president of
 the Women's League of the associ-
 ation, is chairman of this year's
 membership drive. She will be
 assisted by members of the league,
 the association's board of direc-
 tors, and other volunteer workers
 throughout the greater Hornell
 area.

The association depends com-
 pletely upon the support of area
 residents. It has no income, other
 than that from season member-
 ships, door receipts at each con-
 cert, and the funds raised di-
 rectly by the Women's League.

As last year, three types of
 memberships will be available:
 family, which includes husband,
 wife, and members of the imme-
 diate family; adult; and student for
 one who is attending either pub-
 lic school or college.

There is also a special gifts
 category for sponsors, patrons,
 and contributing members, as in
 previous years. Donors from these
 groups receive season member-
 ships at no additional charge.

The other two concerts have
 been scheduled tentatively for
 February 14, 1965, and April 4,
 1965. In announcing these dates,
 Glenn J. Sprague of Big Creek
 Road, Hornell, conductor of the
 orchestra, emphasized that they
 were only tentative dates because
 of the necessity of "working
 around" other engagements and
 commitments of professional mus-
 icians, who supplement area mu-
 sicians in the orchestra.

In commenting on the use of
 professional musicians, Sprague
 said, "The shortage of string play-
 ers in this area makes it necessary
 for us to hire professionals from
 Rochester and Buffalo. On the
 average, there are about 35 local
 musicians in the orchestra. We
 will cut the orchestra with some
 13 professional string players for
 each concert. This cost is a major
 item in our budget—approximately
 40 per cent of our expendi-
 tures. However, the directors and
 I strongly feel that this cost is an
 absolute necessity if we are to
 continue to bring to the Hornell
 area the quality of live symphonic
 music that we have in the past."

The Hornell Symphony Associ-
 ation is a non-profit, educational
 corporation, chartered by New
 York State, and is the legal spon-
 sor of the orchestra. The Women's
 League is an integral part of the
 association and assists it in the
 support of the orchestra. The
 league sponsors the Symphony
 Ball held in May. It also spon-
 sored the art show, held recently
 during Hornell Shop-O-Rama.
