American Red Cross News

The Finance Committee for Allegany County Chapter of American Red Cross last week voted to eliminate the blood program from county Red Cross services, effective July 1, 1965 unless additional funds became available before that date.

Meeting with area Red Cross Representative Ted Dravis and Chapter Chairmn, Mrs. Leon Coffin, he local Finance Committee found fund requirements for 1965-66 which included the blood program amounted to \$16,851. The total amount raised for the 1964-65 campaign was \$14,717.

Since Home Service and Disaster are mandatory services under the chapter's charter, the committee was left no recourse but to eliminate the chapter's most expensive program, the blood program. Budget requirements for the blood program for 1965-66 are \$4329. All other Red Cross programs added together would not provide the funds necessary to continue this service.

Committee advisors have informed both county hospitals and the county medical society of their decision and have assured them that funds are available to continue the program until July 1, 1965.

At present 42.4% of the chapter's local budget goes to the blood program. Increased costs are a result of the greater use of blood and the cost of new plastic bottles now in use. Also, in recent years the chapter has not reached its quota in fund drives and has been forced to use surplus funds to meet operating needs.

Because of the importance of the blood program, the Finance Committee was reluctant to eliminate the service. However, Mr. Dravis stated that the Allegany County Chapter was attempting to give residents of the county more service in dollars and cents than the public was willing to support.

Blood itself, in Red Cross, is never charged for, but if purchased, the \$23 pint total used in county hospitals last year at \$30 per pint charged commercially gives a monetary benefit of \$41,150 to the community. Not included in this total is blood used in community and other regional hospitals by county residents.

Red Cross funds, in many cases throughout the county, are collected through federated drives. Therefore additional funds are

not available on the basis of the year's gift. Recognizing the importance of other agencies involved in federated drives, the committee saw no solution other than larger donations to future Red Cross or federated drives.

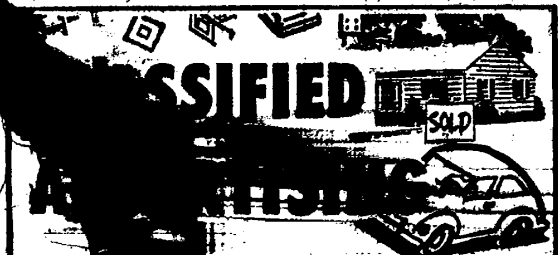
