



The Allegany County board of Supervisors, in unanimous action at Monday's regular monthly meeting voted to accept a resolution to participate in a proposed recreation project with neighboring Steuben County at the Almond dam site in Almond. The hub of the recreation center will be a 60-acre lake constructed with the financial backing of the federal and state governments. Surrounding the water area will be picnic and parking facilities.

Allegany And Steuben Counties Route 21 Resurfacing

J. Burch McMorran, State Superintendent of Public Works has announced receipt of a low bid of \$228,099.40 from Hornell Construction Corp., of Hornell, N. Y., for resurfacing of Route 21 from just west of the Allegany-Steuben County line in the Village of Almond easterly 3.54 miles to the bridge over Canacadea Creek about a half-mile west of the west city line of Hornell. Two bids were received.

The 24-foot and variable-width pavement will be resurfaced with asphalt concrete. The project includes installation of new curbs in Almond and Thacherville, installation of a storm sewer at Thacherville and improving drainage structures in Almond.

Work is expected to begin shortly after a contract is officially executed. The contract will be awarded following a routine check by State engineers of all bids received to the contractor who is found to have submitted the lowest valid bid. There usually is a lapse of about one month between receipt of bids and contract award.

Scheduled for completion by December 1, 1965, all work will be under the supervision of William J. Dennis, district engineer in charge of the Department's district office at Hornell.
