"American Red Cross enters into its County Fall Fund Campaign on October 1". Fund Chairman Jack Collins reminded today. Serving his third year as fund chairman, Mr. Collins also said, "This year's Fund Drive holds great importance because upon its success rest the future of the blood program."

Insufficient funds have threatened the program's future. The Chapter's finance committee has voted to discontinue the service as of July 1, 1965 unless additional funds become available.
In the past year 823 pints of blood were furnished to the Wellsville and Cuba Hospitals. This does not include blood received by residents in regional hospitals such as Hornell, Rochester, etc. All fifty dollars per pint charged commercially, the monetary benefit was \$41,150 to our residents.
