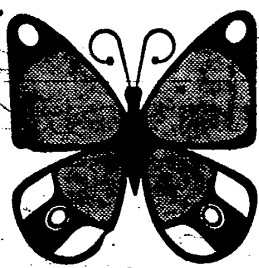
were on both sides of the table. The buffet held a floral piece of Javendar mums, carnations and gladioli.
