Citizens of Andover today were invited to participate in the tenth annual observance of Veterans' Day, Wednesday, November 11, sponsored by the Lynch-Burgett Post No. 397 of The American Legion with the cooperation and support of other civic organizations.

ALFRED, N.Y. — Dr. Finla G. Crawford of Andover has been named co-chairman of the Pace Setting Gifts Committee for the first phase of Alfred University's \$15,505,000 development campaign.

Mr. Samuel D. Lunt, New York investment banker who is General Campaign Chairman, announced the appointment of Dr. Crawford as the University launched its initial drive on Oct. 23 to raise \$2,000,000 in three years.

Dr. Crawford is serving his second year as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Alfred University. He is an alumnus and was first elected to the Board in 1935. He is Vice Chancellor, Emeritus, of Syracuse University where he served on the faculty for 43 years.

Campaign leaders were introduced to nearly 300 prominent residents of Steuben and Allegany Counties at a leadership dinner held in Alfred University's Ade Hall last Friday.

President M. Ellis Drake of Alfred University said that the development program will provide \$9,505,000 for new buildings and \$6,000,000 of additional endowment to accommodate a projected increase of 26 percent in undergraduate enrollment.

Dr. Crawford termed the fund raising effort "a major step in the realization of the Master Plan" drawn by a committee made up of faculty, administration, alumni and trustees. The plan is a "symbol for growth" and represents a "great step forward" which will move Alfred University from its present status as a good university to a great university he said.
