Recipe for "Snappy Supper"

1 cup fine cracker crumbs
3 slightly beaten eggs

Combine ingredients in greased 6 x 10 inch baker. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 40 to 45 minutes. Cut in squares; top each with a dot of catsup, if desired. Serves 6.
