Letchworth State Park had an attendance of approximately 632,000 during the '64 season. Glen Iris Inn, the Museum and all major facilities including comfort stations, are closed for the winter months. However, the Falls Area of the Park will be open to the public during the winter. A winter entrance, extending to the Park from Rt. 19A between Castile and Portageville will be maintained at all time for benefit of park visitors.

The new campus will be located on a 250-acre site on Alfred's west side, bordering West University and Elm Streets and extending back over a sloping plateau once known locally as the Saunders' farm and will be constructed to provide dormitory and classroom space to meet the 1970 anticipated enrollment of 2,300 students as projected by the State University Master Plan issued in 1960.
