The Board of Education of the Greenwood Central School met Monday with all members present.

Plans were reviewed of the needs for services for the next school year, shared with other schools and obtained through the Steuben County Board of Cooperative Educational Services. It was decided to tentatively continue present arrangements but to make a more detailed study later in the school year.

The use and maintenance of the south entrance to the school grounds was discussed. A com-

munication relayed from the Town Board of Greenwood relative to the road was discussed. The question was raised whether this entrance could be turned into a Town road. The Principal was instructed to look into the matter further to obtain information what might be involved and legal proceedings necessary.

Permission was granted for the School Nurse and the Director of Physical Education to attend Syracuse in January the New York State Association for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.

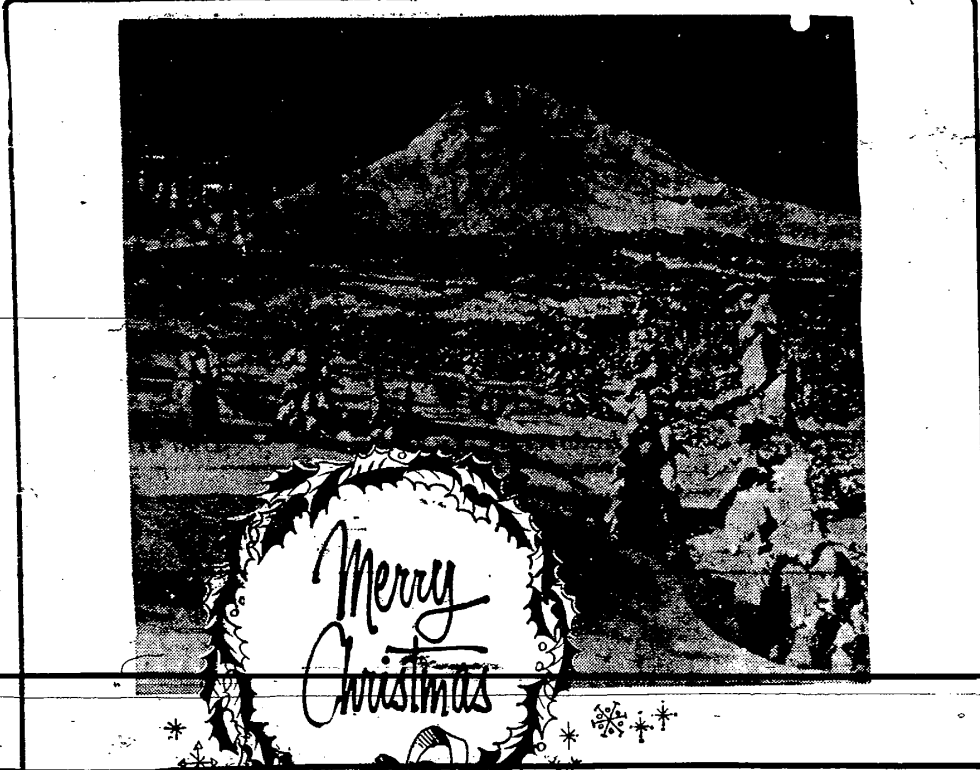
The Greenwood Town basketball team was granted use of the gym once a week when no school programs were scheduled. Bryon Higgins has taken responsibility
