### Aliens Required To Register Thru January

District Director, William J. King of the Immigration and Naturalization Service has estimated that more than 20,000 aliens will report their addresses in the City of Buffalo during January under the Federal Alien Address Report

the Federal Allen Address Report Program.

The Immigration Official said that 77,027 Aliens reported their addresses in the Buffalo District during January 1964.

Mr. King said that all non-cit-irons event those in diplomatic

izens, except those in diplomatic status, foreign representatives of certain international organizations and those admitted temporarily as agricultural laborers, are required to file the address report.

He added that

to file the address report.

He added that any Alien who willfully violates the address report requirement may be fined up to \$200.00, imprisoned for 30 days, and deported.

In addition, Aliens who are not in the United States during January must report their addresses to the Service within 10 days after their return.

The Distict Director, William J. King said that address report cards will be available at all Im-migration and Naturalization Ser-vice Offices and local 'United States Post Offices beginning Jan-uary 1, 1965.
