Joseph R. Joyce Herd receives Name "Jo-Gen"

Joseph R. Joyce, Andover, New York, will have the exclusive use of the prefix "JoGen" in naming all Registered Holstein animals bred in that herd from now on. Use of this prefix name has been granted by the Holstein-Friesian Association of America. It becomes a permanent part of official breed records at that organization's national headquarters in Brattleboro, Vermont.

Some 1,500 prefixes are reserved for Registered Holstein breeders each year; more than 30,000 Holstein dairymen now have their own distinctive prefixes for naming home-bred cattle. Each prefix is a "trade mark" for the purebred Holstein breeder since it is used in all published information concerning his animals. The stories behind prefixes may be interesting since they often represent farm name, the owner's family name or unique combinations of family member names. The exclusive nature of each prefix name often stimulates the creation of clever terms to preserve its "one and only" nature.

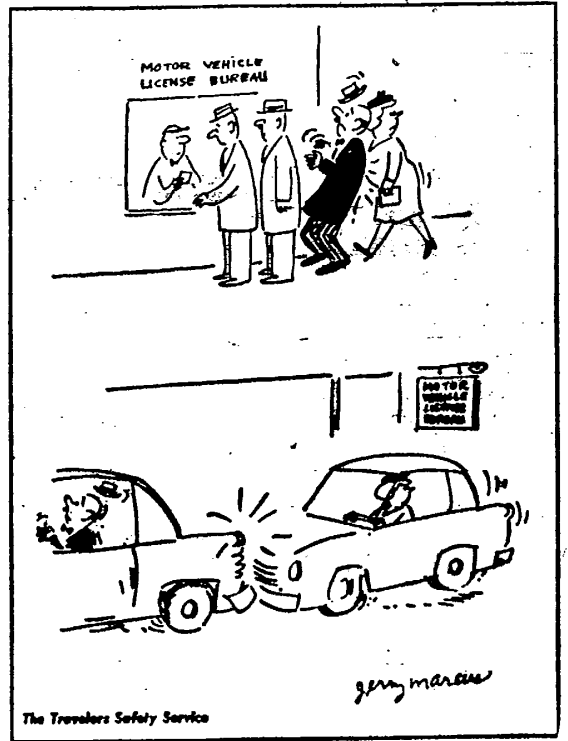
On July 15, 1964, the Southern Tier Library System held a weeding Workshop meeting here from 10 a. m. to 12 noon. About 10 member libraries were present.
