Motorists Check Your Car Lights Often

A reminder to motorists to check personally their car lights often was issued today by Motor Vehicle Commissioner William S. Huits.

"If you don't check your lights regularly, you may unintentionally be asking for trouble by driving partially light blind," the Commissioner noted.

"Since you can't see your lights from the driver's seat, you must check them—every week or two—to make sure they are working," he continued. "However, you can check them from the driver's seat, even though you can't actu-

ally see the lights, if you can see their reflection on a garage or building wall, or on parked cars in a parking space. If your direction lights stop clicking when in use, this is a warning of a burned out bulb or defect in these lights."

Burned out or broken lights can be extremely hazardous, he said. Defective tail or stop lights increase your chances of being hit in the rear by another car. Broken or improperly adjusted headlights reduce your visibility and confuse other drivers. Defective direction signals create dangerous driving situations and result in many accidents and near misses. Headlights aim cannot be checked by the motorist, the Commis-

sioner said. This should be checked at least once a year by a garage mechanic with the proper equipment. Cars eligible for inspection have this done automatically once a year. Owners of newer cars, which are not inspected annually, should arrange for a light aim check at least once a year.

"Checking your lights is a simple operation, and a most important one," Commissioner Huits said. "If you don't check them, and you operate your vehicle without all lights operating properly, you are breaking the law, and you are increasing your chances of having an accident. Check them regularly — it is your responsibility."
