Agway Inc., of Syracuse and Felmont Oil Corp., of New York City will build a \$14 - million industrial complex in Olean to produce nitrogen products for feeds and fertilizers, it was announced. A spokesman for Felmont said the company acquired the former Socony Mobil Oil Refinery property about a year ago specifically for this development and will

create approximately 200 new jobs in the Olean area. Plant operation is expected to begin in about 18 months.

Edward E. Greene of Alfred Station has been promoted to Cadet Platoon Leader of the U. S. Army R.O.T.C. Brigade at Alfred University according to an announcement by Lt. Col. Paul G. Traver, Professor of Military Science. Greene is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Carlton Greene of Alfred Station. He is a junior in the College of Ceramics and is majoring in Ceramic Engineering. Greene has been enrolled in the Reserve Officers Training Corps since his freshman year.
