Gayhart Herd Receives "Eva-Del" Name

Adelbert James Gayhart, Andover, New York, will have the exclusive use of the prefix "Eva-Del" in naming all Registered Holstein dairy animals bred in that herd from now on.

Use of this prefix name has been granted by Holstein-Friesian Association of America; it also becomes a part of official breed records at the national headquarters in Brattleboro, Vermont.

Nearly 1,500 prefixes are reserved for Registered Holstein breeders each year. More than 38,000 are now on file for use in giving distinctive names to home-bred cattle. Reservation and use of these prefix names became an active membership requirement in 1965.

In using an exclusive prefix name for his animals, the prebred Holstein breeder establishes a "trade mark" which is used in all published information concerning the performance of his dairy animals.

The origination of prefix names often stems from farm names, family name combinations, or unique geographical or historical features of the farm operation.

Red Cross Blood Program To Continue

At the Monday night board of Director's Meeting of the Allegany County Chapter, American Red Cross held in the Community Building at Wellsville, the following resolution was passed concerning the status of the blood program:

"In as much as the people of Allegany County have responded with sufficient funds, it will now be possible to continue the blood program in Allegany County for the fiscal year, July 1965 through June 1966."

Alfred Brush, Vice-Chairman of the Chapter read letters from the Wellsville, Alfred and Belmont federated campaigns stating their indication to pay the full quota needed by the Allegany County Chapter of American Red Cross. Mr. Brush commented, that for the first time in many years, the chapter will exceed quota.

Ted Travis, Red Cross Field Representative commended the people of Allegany County and the chapter board stating the chapter will once again be on a good financial status.

Mrs. Leon Coffin, Chapter Chairman, appointed Edward Mergler to add amendments to the present "memorandum of Understanding" with County United Fund and Community Chest organizations. The amendments to define the territory covered by the agreement and the use of publicity on a continuing basis upon the occurrence of a disaster.
