Peace Corps Seeks 70 - 80 Volunteers

County 4-H Club agents in New York State are joining with the Peace Corps to put together a special task force to serve in Brazil and Sierra Leone. The drive to locate 70 - 80 volunteers, over 18, married or single, with practical agricultural and home economics skills, starts the week of March 1 and continues through April 15.

The Agricultural Task Force from New York is the first "state to nation" recruiting program in the history of the Peace Corps, according to Sargeant Shriver, Director of the Peace Corps.

"We were delighted when the New York 4-H Extension Service proposed the idea to the Peace Corps, and offered to donate time and energy to recruit men and women with practical agricultural and home management skills to help in two developing nations," said Shriver.

"Life in the rural areas of our country has historically been dependent on the spirit and principle of neighbor helping neighbor. The New York State Task Force is a way of extending that spirit and principle to our neighbors overseas," Shriver added.

We would like to locate and contact persons, 18 years and over who are eligible for the kind of Peace Corps work offered by this N. Y. S. Task Force project, and give them as much information as possible about it. We will provide interested individuals with an application and help them to properly fill it out.
