Flower borders can enhance the beauty of home grounds. Charles C. Fischer, Extension Specialist in Ornamental Horticulture, will present a lecture on Planning The Flower Planting, March 31, 1965 at 8:00 p. m., at the Presbyterian Parish Hall, Belmont, N. Y. This information will be helpful whether establishing a new garden or renovating the existing flower plans.

Selection of an appropriate site, the size of the planting, and location of plants for height, flower color, and time of bloom are some of the points to be covered. Mr. Fischer will also present information on how to select and care for annuals, biennials, bulbs, tubers, and perennial plants.
