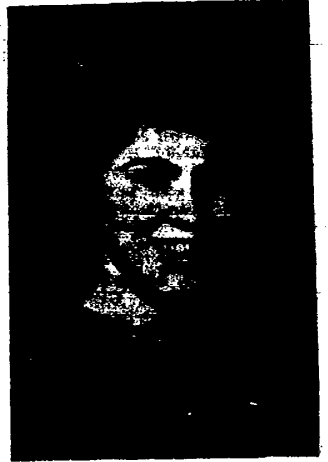
HALL OF FAME
