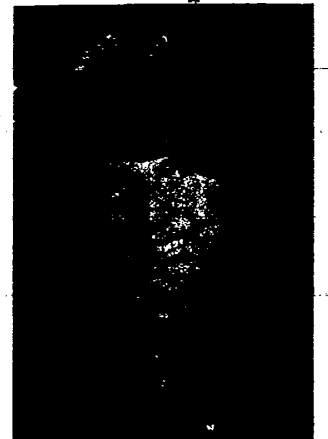
HALL OF FAME

County Teachers' Assoc. Plan Two Workshops

Within the next month, the teachers in Allegany County will be polled concerning their interest in two workshops being planned by the Allegany County Teachers' Association.

Ray Allen of Wellsville, inservice chairman, made the announcement of the survey, the purpose of which is to determine interest in the planned programs.

The two workshops slated are one on Language Arts for Teachers of K-12 to be held July 19-20. James Lanz, language arts coordinator of the Buffalo School system, will be in charge of the workshop.

Discussed by the group was the possibility of uniform policies thru out the county schools on sick leaves, passing grade, and tenure.

A committee was formed to study the limits of authority of committees, officers, and individual members in committing the Allegany County Teachers Association to courses of action, endorsing conferences, inservice programs, and meetings.

The next meeting will be held in Belmont on April 26, with election of officers. William MacCrea of Andover, County Representative to the Central Western Zone for Retirement, will speak on retirement. Interested teachers may attend the meeting.
