 tion.

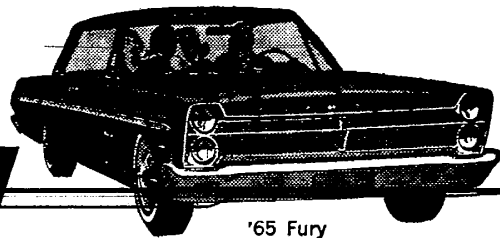
Our school is proud of these students and their fine showing in very stiff competition. They are to be commended for the time and effort which they spent on these projects.

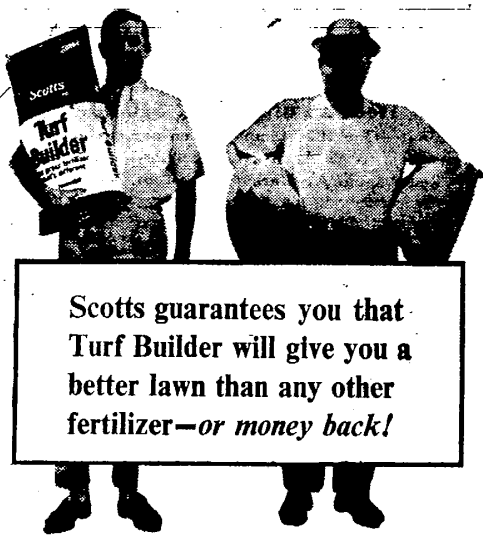
