Sale for Southwestern New York has been scheduled for 1:00 P. M. Saturday, April 24, at the Pike Fairgrounds in Pike, N. Y. Hereford, Angus and Shorthorn calves from 300 lbs., and up, will be offered by beef men from the counties of Chautauqua, Cattaraugus, Allegany, Erie and Wyoming counties. It will be held under the auspices of the New York State Beef Cattlemen's Association.

Between two and three hundred calves will be offered. They will be sold on a graded basis and sorted by sex, grade, breed and weight class. Most of these cattle are purchased in the spring and fail sales for their feeding and finishing in the feedlots of corn producers in the counties north of this producing area. As an indicator of the growth of the beef cattle enterprises, this Spring Sale will bring the number marketed in the past 12 months at over the 1200 number through this one sales area.
