Claudette Corwin Weds Edward W. Stevens Jr.

The marriage of Miss Claudette Corwin and Edward W. Stevens, Jr., was solemnized Saturday, April 10th at 2:30 p. m., in the Methodist Church at Andover, N. Y. The Rev. Roger Williams officiated at the double ring ceremony before an altar decorated with white tapers and baskets of white gladioli.

Preceding the ceremony, James Kelly of Rochester, N. Y., rendered "At Thy World Creating" and "O Perfect Love", accompanied by Mrs. Ralph Burgett, at the organ who also rendered the traditional Wedding March by Lohengrin.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Corwin of Baker St., Andover, and the groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward W. Stevens, Sr., of 17 East Park Road, Pittsford, N. Y.

The bride, escorted to the altar and given in marriage by her father, was attired in a floor-length creation of white peau-de-soie. The bodice featured a portrait neckline, elbow length sleeves adorned with lace appliques and an empire waist enhanced with a tiny bow. The chapel length train was attached at the back of the waist with a bow and draped gracefully to the floor over an A-line skirt encircled with a deep border of lace appliques.
