The appointment of Robert W
Snyder, formerly of Elm Valley
and Ithaca, N. Y., to the position
of Assistant Professor and Extension Economist in Land Use at the
University of Minnesota, Saint
Paul, Minn. was recently announced by University officials: Snyder,
the son of Mr. and Mrs. Herman
Snyder of Alfred, received the
doctorate of philosophy degree
from Cornell University in February. His studies at that institution, largely under the direction
of Dr. Howard E. Conklin, Professor of Land Economics, concentrated on agricultural economics, ressor of Land Economics, concentrated on agricultural economics, city and regional planning, and public administration and finance. At the University of Minnesota. Dr. Snyder will develop new ex-

tension education programs con-cerned with a broad range of land use, community development and public finance. He was employed as an Extension Associate at Cornell University in 1963 and at that time served on the Advisory Com-mittee for the Southwestern New mittee for the Southwestern New York Resource Development Project. He also served on the College of Agriculture Resource Development Committee, where he was instrumental in planning for a series of regional symposia on "Land, Water, People and Economic Growth" in the Spring of 1964, one of the earlier statewide efforts by the Extension Service efforts by the Extension Service to stimulate wiser use of natural resources to sustain economic health in rural areas.

Previous to his work and studies at Cornell, Dr. Snyder served as a passenger transport pilot with the Atlantic Division of the Military Air Transport Service. His duties included frequent trips to Europe, North Africa, and the Arctic. doctoral degree comprised a detailed study of rural non-farmland in Tompkin's County, New York. 
