This is a service provided by the district, at cost, to its cooperators. The District also brought several thousand trees for the 4-H Clubs of Allegany and Steuben Counties.

These trees will be planted for many purposes: Christmas trees, future timber crop and protection of our precious top soil.

There are about sixty-one cooperators who will be planting approximately one hundred and sixty-seven acres of trees.

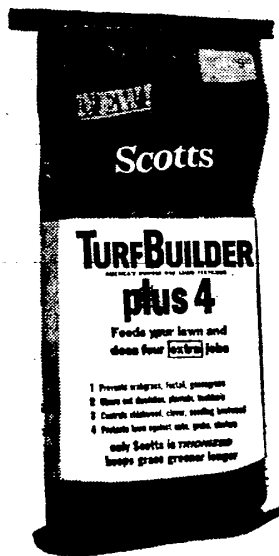
