George Carpenter Mental Health Dies Following Short Illness

George Arthur Carpenter, 64, a local resident for the past 34 years and former mayor, died Monday at the Wyoming Hospital, Warsaw, where he had been taken after becoming ill at his summer camp at Silver Lake.

Born Nov. 1, 1900, in Hornell, Mr. Carpenter was a son of Frank and Marian Hollenbeck, Carpenter. He was married to Carol Ryckman Carpenter, who survives, on June 22, 1931.

Mr. Carpenter had been employed by Worthington Corporation in Wellsville for 22 years, having begun work there Jan. 25, 1943. He was originally employed as an expeditor in the purchasing department, and at the time of his death was supervisor of field service in the service department. He graduated from Hornell High School and attended Allegany College.
