The accident occurred about 150 feet West of the Promised Land Rd., in the Town of Portville. Rushed to Olean General Hospital in the Westons Mills firemen's ambulance the victims were pronounced dead on arrival. Troopers said Mr. Walters sustained fractures of the skull, neck and both legs. Mrs. Moyer suffered a fractured skull, neck and chest. Certificates of accidental death were issued by Coroner William MacDuffie. Mr. Walters had completed a piano-playing engagement at the Hotel Fassett at 1 a. m. He was scheduled to play in the Hotel's Gold Room again Saturday night.
