Rev. Floyd Aldrich Accepts Call To Andover First Baptist Church

The members of the First Baptist Church are pleased that their new Pastor, Rev. Floyd Aldrich has moved into the parsonage and is ready to assume his new duties here in Andover.

Rev. Aldrich comes from a family long active in church work. His father was a Baptist Pastor, his mother's father was a Baptist Pastor and his foster mother was a Missionary in China.

Rev. Aldrich was born in Watertown, N. Y., graduated from Adams Center Central School in 1928, received his A.B. Degree in Sociology from Juniata College in 1934 and after completion of two years study at Pittsburgh-Zenith Theological Seminary, was ordained in 1937. In 1945 he received his B.D. Degree from Winnebrenner Graduate School of Divinity at Findlay, Ohio. He served as Chaplain in the U. S. Army during World War II.

He has had various churches in Western Pennsylvania, including Shinglehouse. In New York State he has served Baptist Churches in Ransomville, Preston Hollow Hartford and Hague. Rev. Aldrich has had experience with boys work through such organizations as Y.M.C.A., Boy Scouts and De Molay.

Rev. and Mrs. Aldrich have two children, Linda, who is married and lives in Rochester and David who this year graduated from high school and is registered to enter Syracuse University this Fall.

Rev. Aldrich will bring his first sermon as Pastor, Sunday morning at 11:00 A. M.
