



James H. Kessler Awarded Citation

James H. Kessler, supervising principal at Andover Central School, was honored by the Central School Board of Education Monday evening, June 28th at Commencement exercises.

A citation was presented to him by Alan H. Tuttle, President of the Board of Education, in recognition of his 36 years as a chief school administrator on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the American Association of School Administrators.

Mr. Kessler accepted the post of supervising principal at Andover on July 1, 1946. He served as Principal of Theresa High School from 1930 to 1943, and from 1943-45 served with the American Red Cross on Staten Island, as well as Principal at George Junior Republic before coming to Andover.

A graduate of Hobart College and Syracuse University with bachelor of arts and a master in education degrees, he has done graduate work at Columbia University.

Mr. and Mrs. Kessler have three children: James Kessler, Mathematics teacher at Greece, N. Y.; Dr. Richard Kessler, Surgeon at Veteran's Administration in New York City; and Miss Lee Kessler who will be attending Grove City College, Pennsylvania, in her sophomore year.

All of the chief school administrators in New York State were honored through the presentation of a citation to Dr. Franklyn S. Barry, superintendent of schools in Syracuse, on June 11, by Edward S. Foster, president of the New York State School Boards Association at a meeting of the Association's Board of Directors in Cooperstown. The AASA, a professional organization is made up of 17,000 school administrators and was founded in 1865 at Harrisburg, Pa.
