Construction of a ski slope, which is to be used by students at the State University Agricultural and Technical College, Alfred, as part of their winter intramural program, was begun last week. The slope located off Route 244 adjacent to the new campus, is being built by the Alfred Track Student

Association at an estimated cost of \$100,000. Dr. Roger F. Rowe, dean of the college, said. Plans for the 30-acre skiing area call for the installation of a 1,500-foot T-bar lift, with a capacity of 1,200 skiers per hour, and floodlights which will allow night skiing. An existing structure at the foot of the slope will be converted into a shelter. Trails will be cut for

both advanced and novice skiers.

Firefighting equipment and mutual aid services will be highlighted at demonstrations to be undertaken Friday evening. Concluding the week's activities will be the annual out-of-County Firemen's Parade at 8 p. m., Saturday. Marchers will follow the same route as in Thursday's parade. A total of \$325 and a trophy will be awarded to units in the two parades, according to Young, parade marshal.
