**DAR Hold Meeting At Belmont**

The July meeting of Catherine Schuyler Chapter, DAR, was held at the Belmont Methodist Church with thirty-one members and guests present.

Mrs. George C. Schram, Regent, presided. Three guests and an associate member were introduced by Chapter members.

As part of the National Defense program, pending legislation in regard to amendments to the United Nations' Chapter was reviewed. Emphasis was placed on the fact that should such legislation be passed, the position of the United States in the Security Council and the Economic and Social Council would be greatly weakened.

The guest speaker was Miss Helen A. Wayne, Supervisor of Indian Affairs, State Department of Social Welfare. She is consultant and advisor to the New York State Indians in regard to their problems—making appropriate referrals to the various State Departments, be it in regard to roads, legal council, social service, education, rehabilitation, housing etc. She spoke about life on the Reservations today, pointing out that the Indians have both ability and initiative—when given a little help, they use these capabilities as starting points toward self-help.

The Seneca Nation is a case in point: they have turned the Kinzua Dam project from what could have been a catastrophe into an opportunity. It is interesting to note that the problems of resettlement and relocation have brought the several Tribes and Nations closer together, and have intensified their love of their lands.

The August meeting, our oper meeting, will be held in Friendship, N. Y., with Mrs. Edward C. Underwood speaking on "National Defense".

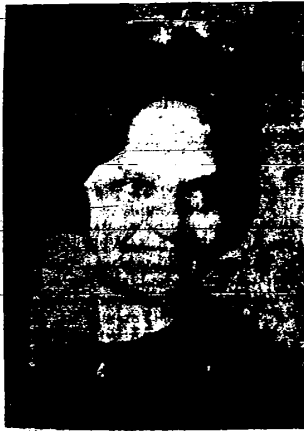
