Lightning caused heavy loss throughout the county during the storm Thursday night. Lightning struck on the farm of Frank Yocum, near Rushford, during the severe electrical storm, starting a fire which destroyed a large dairy barn, machinery, two animals and two motor vehicles. The steeply pitched roof of the barn was struck, slate roofing cracked and shingles and boarding torn away as the bolt followed a line to the bell, blowing out fuses in a vestry box. It is believed the \$1,200, electrically-operated bells may require extensive repairs. A small barn on the property owned by Mrs. Albert Lunn of Friendship, used for storage of machinery, was destroyed by flames after apparently being struck by lightning during the storm.
